THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ARMSTRONG

BY-LAW NO. 2017-26

BEING A BY-LAW TO ESTABLISH, GOVERN AND REGULATE THE EARLTON-ARMSTRONG TOWNSHIP VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT AND TO REPEAL BY-LAW <u>2014-10</u>

WHEREAS the Fire Protection and Prevention Act, S.O. 1997, c. 4, s. 2, provides, generally, that every municipality shall establish a program of fire education, fire prevention, fire safety and provide such other fire protection services as it deems necessary and shall, in discharging its responsibilities, establish a fire department,

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Armstrong enacts as follows:

- 1. In this By-Law, unless the context otherwise requires,
- a. approved means approved by the municipal council,
- b. *clerk-treasurer administrator* means the person appointed by Council to act as Clerk-Treasurer Administrator for the Corporation
- c. corporation means the Corporation of the Township of Armstrong
- d. council means the Council of the Township of Armstrong
- e. department means the Earlton-Armstrong Fire Department
- f. executive means the Earlton-Armstrong Fire Department's Fire Chief, the Deputy Fire Chief, the Captains and Fire Prevention Officers
- g. *deputy chief* means the person appointed by Council to act on behalf of the Fire Chief of the Fire Department in the case of an absence or a vacancy in the office of the Fire Chief
- h. *fire chief* means the person appointed by a by-law of the Council to act as Fire Chief for the Corporation
- i. fire department means the Township of Armstrong fire department
- j. *fire protection services* includes fire suppression, fire prevention, fire safety education, communication, training of persons involved in the provision of

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fire protection services, rescue, tiered response, extrication and emergency services and the delivery of all those services

- k. *member* means any persons employed in, or appointed to a fire department and assigned to undertake fire protection services, and includes officers and volunteer firefighters
- tiered response means any member of the fire department who provides emergency first aid services either voluntarily or for a nominal consideration, honorarium, while waiting for paramedics arrival
- m. *volunteer firefighter* means a person who provides fire protection services either voluntarily or for a nominal consideration, honorarium, training or activity allowance.
- 2- (a) A Department for the Corporation of the Township of Armstrong to be known as the **Earlton-Armstrong Fire Department** is hereby established and the head of the department shall be known as the *fire chief*.
 - (b) The goals/mission statement of the department shall be as those contained in Appendix "A" of this by-law.
 - (c) In addition to the *Chief* of the department, the department personnel shall consist of a *Deputy-Chief*, *Captains*, *Fire Prevention Officer* and the other *officers* and members as from time to time may be deemed necessary by Council or by the Fire Marshall's Office.
- (d) The department shall be organized as per **Appendix "B"** forming part of this by-law.
- 3- (a) A person wishing to become a volunteer member of the Fire Department shall complete an application supplied by the personnel at the **Town Hall Office or by the Fire Department**.
 - (b) The Fire Chief will receive and review the application with the Executive of the Fire Department. If all conditions are met, then the Fire Department's Executive shall vote on the acceptance or rejection of the applicant to become a volunteer firefighter within the Earlton-Armstrong Fire Department.
 - (c) Only those applications retain by the *Fire Department's Executive* shall be submitted to *Council* and discussed in close cession. Those application retained by *Council* shall return to the *Fire Chief's* office.
 - (d) If more than one application is retained, then the *Fire Chief* and the *Fire Department's Executive shall* conduct interviews of the applicants and select the future *volunteer firefighter* or *volunteer firefighters* to fill in the vacant position or positions.
- 4- (a) A person appointed as a member of the department shall be on probation for a period of **one** (1) **year**, during which period the probationary member shall take such special training and examinations as may be required by the Fire Chief, and
 - (b) A person appointed as a member of the department has the duty to assist to as many meetings, training and calls as possible. If a firefighter fails to be an active member of the Brigade, the *Chief* of the department may recommend to council that he/she be dismissed.

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- (c) If a probationary member appointed for fire-fighting duties fails any examination, the Chief of the department may recommend to council that he/she be dismissed.
- (d) A member may request a leave of absence from active duty by submitting such a request in writing to the Fire Chief to be forwarded to Council. Council will decide to give or not the Leave of Absence.
- 5- (a) The *Chief* of the department may reprimand, suspend or recommend dismissal of any member for insubordination, inefficiency, misconduct, tardiness or for noncompliance with any of the provisions of this By-Law or general orders and departmental rules that, in the opinion of the *Chief*, would be detrimental to the discipline and efficiency of the department,
 - (b) The Disciplinary Policy of the department shall be as established in Law No. 2012-38 of the Township of Armstrong, being a by-law to violence and harassment in the work place Prevention Policy for th Township of Armstrong.
- 2018-27 (2012-38 (c) Any member may voluntarily resign from the Fire Department by submitting a resignation in writing to the Fire Chief to be forwarde..... Council. All Fire Department property assigned to the member must be returned to the Fire Department upon the member's resignation.
- The remuneration of all *members* of the department shall be as determined 6by Council.
- 7- The *Fire Chief* of the department is responsible to council for the proper administration and operation of the department. The Fire Chief is under the general direction of council and;
- Council shall review the document Earlton-Armstrong Fire Department (a) Standard Operating Guideline (January 2015) after which the Standard Operating Guideline can be adopted by the Fire Department (revised May 2017)
- shall study and review the standard operational guidelines, general orders (b) and departmental rules as may be necessary for the care and protection of the department equipment and personnel, and for the efficient operation of the department, provided that such orders and rules do not conflict with the provisions of any by-laws of the municipality
- shall review periodically the policies and procedures of the department and (c) may establish an advisory committee consisting of such officers as he/she may determine from time to time to assist him/her in these duties
- shall take all proper measures for the prevention, control and (d) extinguishment of fires and for the protection of life and property
- shall enforce all municipal by-laws respecting fire prevention (e)
- shall adhere to the provisions of the Fire Marshals Act (f)
- 8. The *Fire Chief* or designate is directed and authorized to have members of the department:
- a) pull down or demolish any building or structure to prevent the spread of fire;

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- b) when unable to contact the property owner, to take such necessary action (under (a) above) which may include boarding up or barricading of building or property to guard against fire or other danger, risk or accident, and;
- c) the *corporation* may recover expenses incurred by such necessary action in a manner provided by the Municipal Act.
- 9- The *Fire Chief* is responsible for the enforcement of this by-law and the general orders and department rules.
- 10- (a) The *Deputy Fire Chief* is responsible to the *Fire Chief* for the activities of the divisional functions that are supervised by the *Deputy Fire Chief*, and
 - (b) The *Deputy Fire Chief* has the same authority and responsibility as the *Fire Chief* and shall perform all the duties of the *Fire Chief* in the *Fire Chief*'s absence.
- 11- The *Department* performs the following divisional functions:
 - -Division of Administration,
 - -Division of apparatus, equipment and communications,
 - -Division of fire fighting
 - -Division of fire prevention
 - -Division of training
 - -Division of tiered response
 - -Division of auto extrication response
- **12-** The Division of **Administration** is the responsibility of the *Chief or designate* for carrying out the following duties of the division:
- -Provide administration facilities for the department,
- -Prepare the departmental budget and exercise control of the budget,
- -Prepare the firefighters' remuneration sheet for the payroll of the department and initiate requisitions for materials and services and certify all accounts of the *department*,
- -Maintain personnel records in accordance with the policy of the Corporation,
- -Arrange for the provision of medical services,
- -Prepare the annual report of the department,
- -Carry out the general administrative duties of the department,
- -Must submit to the municipal office a copy of all documents that are in each *Firefighter*'s files.
- -Must submit to the municipal office all budget, firefighters' remuneration sheet for the payroll, inventory of materials and vehicles, all records of the *fire* department activities in accordance with the policy of the Corporation.

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- 13- The division of Apparatus, Equipment and Communications is the responsibility of the *Fire Chief or designate* for the carrying out of the following duties of the department:
- a. Maintain and keep in repair all existing buildings, apparatus and equipment of the *department*,
- b. Receive alarms and dispatch apparatus,
- c. Prepare specifications for the purchase of apparatus and equipment,
- d. Prepare the annual report and budget of the division of Apparatus, equipment and Communications to be submitted to the division of administration.
- 14- (a) The *Fire Chief or designate* is responsible for ensuring that the following duties pertaining to the function of the division of *Firefighting* are carried out:
- i) prevent, control and extinguish fires,
- ii) conduct investigations of fire in order to determine cause, origin, and, where required, to request appropriate agencies to assist with the investigation,
- iii) respond and assist at such emergencies as may be required by the *Fire Chief*,
- iv) perform pre-emergency planning,
- v) perform apparatus maintenance and cleaning duties,
- vi) prepare the annual report and budget of the division of Fire Fighting to be submitted to the division of administration.
- (b) Captains are in command of the company to which they are assigned and are responsible to the officers in charge for proper operation of that company.
- 15- The *Fire Chief or designate* is responsible for ensuring that the following duties pertaining to the function of the division of *Fire Prevention* are carried out:
- (a) develop approved fire preventions, fire safety and public education policy,
- (a) carry out the duties and activities of fire prevention, fire duties and public education policy,
- (b) maintain fire loss records, and
- (d) prepare the annual report and budget of the division of Fire Prevention to be submitted to the division of administration.
- **16-** The *Fire Chief* is responsible for ensuring that the following duties pertaining to the function of the division of **Training** are carried out;
- (a) adopt the **Ontario Firefighters Standards** curriculum, and conduct training for all *members* in accordance with the approved training program,
- (b) administer training programs,
- (c) prepare and conduct examinations of members as required, and
- (d) prepare the annual report and budget of the division of Training to be submitted to the division of administration.
- 17- The *Fire Chief or designate* is responsible for ensuring that the following duties pertaining to the function of the division of **Tiered Response** are carried out:

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- (a) develop an approved Tiered Response program,
- (b) conduct training for capable *members* to perform the duties of the **Tiered** Response division, and
- (c) *only trained members* shall respond and assist at such emergencies as may be deemed necessary by the *Fire Chief*.
- (d) *only trained members* shall be present at a scene of a person in need of medical help, while waiting for paramedics arrival.
- 18- The *Fire Chief or designate* is responsible for ensuring that the following duties pertaining to the function of the division of **Auto Extrication**Response are carried out;
- (a) develop an approved Auto Extrication Response program,
- (b) conduct training for capable *members* to perform the duties of the Auto Extrication Response division, and
- (c) *only trained members* shall respond and assist at such emergencies as may be deemed necessary by the *Fire Chief* for extraction of people in vehicles.
- 19- When the *Fire Chief* designates a *member* to act in the position of an officer, such *member* when so acting, has all the authority and responsibility of such officer and shall perform all the duties of the officer replaced.
- **20**-The *Fire Department* shall not respond to a call with respect to a fire or other emergency outside the approved response areas of the municipality except:
- a. an emergency which in the opinion of the *Fire Chief* threatens any property or person in the municipality or;
- b. property situated outside the municipality that is owned or occupied by the municipality,
- c. in a municipality with which an agreement has been entered into to provide *fire protection*,
- d. on property with respect to which an agreement has been entered into with any person or corporation to provide *fire protection* therefore, or;
- e. on property beyond the municipal boundary where the *Fire Chief*, or designate, determines that immediate action is necessary to preserve and protect life and/or property and the correct department is notified and/or assumes command. The *Fire Chief* shall subsequently inform the head of council of such response.
- f. from another provincial agency which has an agreement with the Township to provide specialized operations (i.e. Auto Extrication, Mutual Aid, Tiered Response, etc.)
- 21- This by-law comes into effect the day it is passed by *council*.
- 22- That by-law No. 2014-10 is hereby repealed.

PRIMARY GOALS OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT


